Volunteer Expectations

SEAONC and CalEMA appreciate your commitment to the Safety Assessment Program (SAP). The SEAONC Volunteer Reserve Corps directory contains contact and qualification information for members who have been trained as Safety Assessment Program (SAP) evaluators and is maintained by the SEAONC office and Disaster Emergency Services (DES) committee.

The SAP program and deployment requests for volunteers is coordinated by the California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA). In the event of a deployment request from CalEMA, SEAONC Reserves Corps Volunteers in the directory will be notified by the DES committee. Primary notification is made via email and announcement posted on the SEAONC webpage. Response to deployment requests from CalEMA will be coordinated through SEAOC.

The following is a list of expectations for all who choose to participate. If you have any concerns or questions regarding the program, please contact the current Disaster Emergency Services (DES) Committee Chair.

- You must be a SEAONC member, a registered Disaster Service Worker, and a licensed Civil Engineer who has completed ATC-20/SAP training to be listed on the SEAONC Volunteer Reserve Corps directory.
- All volunteers must assess their ability to respond to a future earthquake. This assessment includes – but is not limited to – the advance consent of the volunteer’s employer (note: as a general rule, local volunteers are not activated for a local disaster).
- If your personal profile information changes, please complete an updated version of this profile form and submit it to the SEAONC office.
- Primary deployment notification of SEAONC Reserve Corps members is made via email and announcement posted on the SEAONC webpage. Secondary contact methods may include phone, cellular phone, or pager messages. This announcement will provide general information about the nature of the deployment and how to respond. Once you are approved for deployment, you will be provided information on where to go and what to do. Do not self-deploy without approval.
- Neither CalEMA, SEAONC nor the DES Committee can assure you of an assignment to a specific area that experienced a specific level of damage, or a specific building type. Assignments are given based on requests made to CalEMA by the affected jurisdictions. **The most likely assignment for all volunteers will be to assess single-family, residential structures based solely on the pervasiveness of those buildings.**
- Disasters Service Worker cards issued by CalEMA are to be used for CalEMA official business only. Misuse of the cards could result in criminal prosecution. We make this point because a few individuals misused the cards following the 1994 Northridge Earthquake to gain access to restricted areas, while not acting in an official capacity.
- The reserve corps is activated when a deployment request is made by CalEMA. Activation may not occur immediately after a disaster. In fact, activation may not occur for several days, depending on the circumstances.
- Please remember that you are a volunteer and a professional. You will be evaluating structures for people whose lives have been disrupted. You are expected to remain sensitive to this fact throughout your assignment.
